Accountability for Health Plans Under the 2024 Medicare Advantage Final Rule April 3 – 10:00-11:00 a.m.

Target Audience: hospital leadership, legal, insurance/administrative specialists

This session will analyze the 2024 Medicare Advantage and Part D Final Rule. Presenters will outline the key changes that will affect patients and healthcare providers, including utilization management requirements, marketing requirements, the star ratings program, and advancing health equity. In particular, attendees can expect to focus on changes to the prior authorization process, highlighting the new continuity of care requirements and changes made to reduce disruptions for beneficiaries.

Speakers will present attendees with several examples of how the final rule aims to increase accountability for Medicare Advantage plans and give patients and healthcare providers more tools and leverage for ensuring consistent access to care. Participants will be able to analyze the final rule and apply concepts to provide improved access to coverage and care.

CMS Hospital Infection Prevention and Control

This webinar will discuss the changes CMS made to the infection control standards as well as the interpretive guidelines. Attendees will learn how hospitals can comply with the regulation, including verifying qualifications of the infection preventionist, having a hospital-wide antibiotic stewardship program, and following nationally recognized infection control standards. The Joint Commission standards on the Antibiotic Stewardship Program will be discussed briefly.

- Recall the standard and new interpretive guidelines for infection prevention and control.
- Relate key requirements for an infection prevention and control program.
- Identify the requirements for the infection preventionist and antibiotic stewardship lead.
- Describe the incorporation of infection prevention and control and antibiotic stewardship into the QAPI program.
