2023 and Beyond: Issues, National Trends and Governing Strategically (IAG0616)

Overview

The issues and challenges facing hospitals are numerous, varied, and complex. From the disruptors, like retailers Amazon and Walmart, to the large insurance companies, like Aetna teaming up with CVS, these nontraditional providers of care are now focused on scooping up primary care. Automated intelligence, cyber-securing, and telehealth are also changing the health care landscape.

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Understanding Hospital Board Responsibilities Under the Medicare Conditions of Participation/Accreditation Standards (IAG0720)

Overview

Over the last several years, there has been increasing scrutiny by regulators and accrediting organizations of the hospital governing body's role in hospital compliance with Medicare's conditions of participation. This presentation will examine the regulatory requirements for hospital boards and describe situations when governing bodies have been cited.

- Describe governing boards' responsibilities for patient rights, quality improvement, and medical staff credentialing.
 - Describe minimum requirements for medical staff bylaws, rules, and regulations, and governing body oversight.
 - Discuss hospital responsibilities for credentialing non-physician staff in the hospital.
 - Explain the differences in medical staff credentialing regulations for telemedicine and onsite providers.
